## VILLAGE OF GRANVILLE HOUSEHOLD WASTE PICK UP (2011 Clean-up Fix-up Weeks)

### **April 25 through April 29**

From April 25 through April 29, the Service Department will pick up unwanted wood and construction materials from Village households. Unwanted materials should be placed at the edge of the road or behind the curb before Monday, April 25. In order to expedite the collection process, Village crews will be making only ONE PASS on each street to collect unwanted wood and construction materials.

### **May 2 through May 6**

From May 2 through May 6, the Service Department will pick up other household waste items. All such items that are intended for pick up should be placed neatly at the road edge prior to Monday, May 2. In order to expedite the collection process, Village crews will be making only ONE PASS on each street to collect those household waste items.

### **What to do with Paint**

It is clear from the volume of calls we receive that residents want to do the right thing by getting rid of unwanted paint in a safe and environmentally sound manner.

Because old lead-based paints are toxic, they should not be reused, but the new oil-based and latex paints are great candidates for recycling and reuse.

To responsibly deal with unwanted oil-based and latex paints, follow these steps:

- Identify the type of paint you have left – water-based (latex) or oil-based.
- Determine if the paint is still usable. If you have usable latex or oil-based paint, use it or donate it to someone who can (neighbors, local nonprofits, school drama clubs and art departments, camp grounds or parks, sign painters, building contractors, or service organizations). Your latex paint is probably usable if it is less than 10 years old, has not been exposed to freezing temperatures, mixes and spreads smoothly, and does not contain mercury. Oil-based paints are generally usable if they are less than 15 years old, mix and spread smoothly, and do not contain lead.

- Unusable paint can be dried up and disposed in your trash. As long it is in solid form, trash haulers will take it. Small amounts (less than 3 inches) of unusable paint can be dried by popping the top and waiting, or by spreading it on cardboard. You can dry larger amounts by mixing with an absorbent such as sawdust, sand or kitty litter. Leave the lids off to show the trash collector that it is hardened.
- Do not save the hardened paint for Granville Village's collection event. It is not dangerous in a public sanitary landfill and will be picked up as part of your weekly waste collection. The approximate cost to us (and you) is \$11 per gallon can to dispose through Granville Village's collection events, whether the can is full or empty.

### **What to do with Appliances Containing CFC (Freon)**

Due to EPA regulations, any appliance containing CFC (Freon) must be tagged by a certified industry professional stating it is CFC free. (It is illegal to vent Freon into the atmosphere; it must be removed by a certified technician and captured for recycling.) Once the Freon is removed, the appliance can be easily recycled. Some companies will remove the Freon and place a sticker on the item so that it can be recycled. Others will take the appliance and do all of the steps at their own facility, thus saving you the time and expense of hauling it elsewhere.
